NAPLAN

The Year 3 and 5 students will be involved in NAPLAN next week from Tuesday to Thursday. As a school, we have a very low key approach to NAPLAN. We use the data as it was intended – to inform whole school planning and initiatives. The children have been working with their teachers so that they understand the format and conditions and will complete the assessments in their classrooms. Please keep things low key at home as well. The more NAPLAN is hyped up, of course the more anxious children will be. There is no need for this. Children will be exposed to many ways of working and various assessments over their years at primary and secondary and this is only one of them.

New initiatives

This term we have introduced two new initiatives that we are trialling. The first is being run by Mrs Trisha Bell-Bartels who is working with a group of year 5/6 students and will work across all levels by the end of the year. Teachers selected students who they believe would be invested in working to enhance their learning. Students were selected using a variety of criteria including strong social skills and vocabulary, the ability to find and solve problems and who work well in a group setting.

The school received a small amount of money for the government's tutoring initiative and we have employed Rachael Zabielski to support students and teachers across the school in the area of Maths. Again we have decided to focus on one year level at a time, starting with the year 6s who have a limited time left at OLMC. In some cases, Rachael will work with small groups of children and in others, she will teach the class while the teacher takes the small groups. This is to ensure we are able to support all students as best we can.

A reminder to label all school uniform items especially jumpers & rugby tops and food/drink containers with your child's name. This will help stop the vast amounts of these items that end up in lost property.




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OLMC CHALLENGE COLLECTIVE

"In February 2016 the media was alive with stories that excited the imaginations and minds of countless people all over the globe. One of the world's most celebrated thinkers, Albert Einstein published his general theory of relativity. This theory described how gravity warps and distorts space-time. When Albert Einstein was alive he believed that no one would be able to prove his theory that gravitational waves existed. He didn't doubt there were other great minds thinking about his theory or posing their own ideas; he had not conceptualised the speed of technological change that would enable us to prove our thinking. A century later, great thinkers used the Advanced Laser Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory Detectors to identify the existence of gravitational waves and prove the theory of Albert Einstein.

All this began with an idea from a very bright mind!

At OLMC, some of our students will be enriched and extended in a group called the "Challenge Collective".

In 2021, starting in Term 2, we will be providing further enrichment and extension opportunities for our students who have been identified by their class teacher as 'highly able'. This is not just for students who are ahead academically.

Highly able children includes students whose intellectual, physical, creative or social ability is more advanced than those of a similar age. Within the high-ability spectrum, ability, aptitude and performance will vary. Highly able students may be advanced in more than one area of the curriculum.

Generally, highly able students demonstrate the following characteristics:

the capacity to learn at faster rates

the capacity to find and solve problems

the capacity to make connections and manipulate abstract ideas.

On Mondays each week, Mrs. Bell-Bartels will be leading the 'Challenge Collective', which will provide further educational enrichment to students nominated by their classroom teachers. This term it will be the Senior Level students who will participate.
