Dear Parents,

This week was the commemoration of the Japanese invading Darwin 76 years ago. As I was driving to work I was privileged to listen to Mr Alan Day who served in the Australian Army. At OLMC we are introducing learning dispositions. Learning dispositions are attitudes to learning or ways of thinking about learning. One of our dispositions is determination.

## A learner who shows the disposition of determination...

- has a growth mindset uses positive self talk
- sees things through
- tries different waysstrives for success



Determination is a critical life skill and disposition for learning. We show determination when we persevere through difficulties and challenges. It is needed when a son or daughter decides learning something new is "too hard."

Some strategies to help encourage the disposition of determination are:

- Working on something that doesn't come easy. Watch your child/children closely to see what might be difficult for them. When they can master a skill for which they struggle, they learn that determination has a payoff.
- Set a good example of determination. When your children see you persevere through things that are difficult, they will learn from your example.
- 3. Don't protect them from failure. Often we are tempted as parents (and teachers) to protect our children from doing something that is difficult. Help and encourage them to succeed. Remind them and coach them. But if, in the end, they fail, let them and then help them to learn from their experience.

4. Model a growth mindset for your children. Showing your children that you are excited by challenges, see mistakes as learning opportunities, and understand the value of practice and trying different strategies will go a long way in cultivating their growth mindsets! Children with a growth mindset persist in the face of challenges because they understand that effort and hard work can change ability and intelligence. When children are in a fixed mindset, they tend to give up easily when they encounter obstacles, because they believe that they don't have what it takes to learn hard things.


