Introducing the OLMC Learning Dispositions

With new technology rapidly advancing the way in which people work and live, children's place in the world is changing very quickly. How do we as parents and teachers prepare our children for a world that is unknown to us?

Education used to be based upon rote learning content. This was a focus upon learning and retaining facts that were thought to be useful for children throughout their lives. Today if you'd like to know the answer to many things you can simply use Google and whilst knowing a certain amount of facts is useful, for example, being able to say the alphabet or recall multiplication facts, our children also need to understand the skills for how they learn and what they can do when faced with something new. This is where the 'Dispositions for Learning' come in.

Learning dispositions are characteristics or attitudes to learning that are life skills. In consultation with parents, students and teachers the dispositions that we have chosen to embed at OLMC are:

Curiosity Self motivation Creativity Determination Collaboration Making connections Reflection Taking Risks

As a school we will be learning about these over the term and highlighting when we see them being used in our classroom and school community. Each week we will unpack a disposition a little more in the newsletter.

How can parents help to teach the dispositions at home.

Parents are powerful teachers of learning dispositions for their children. Rather than give your child the answer to a question help your child to find an answer for themselves. Accept that finding an incorrect answer and recognising that this is not quite correct, is as important as finding the right solution. As a parent it is important to show your child you are learning too. You can learn with and from your child. Parents can model how to cope with trying something new and not quite getting it right first time. For example cooking something new or learning a new skill for work. Model how to celebrate challenge as well as success. If you show a "can do" attitude then your child will do the same. Children who see themselves as someone who tries new things, keeps going when it is hard, knows when to stop and ask for help, and learns from making mistakes are children who will be successful in an unknown world.


