
KEEP UP THE GREEN WORK EVERYONE



At OLMC we are working on 8 learning dispositions. Learning dispositions are attitudes to learning or ways of thinking about learning. One of our dispositions is curiosity.

A learner who shows curiosity...

- asks questions
- learns from other sources
- always wonders
- wants to know more



"The important thing is not to stop questioning. Curiosity has its own reason for existing." -- Albert Einstein

It's no secret that curiosity makes learning more effective and enjoyable. Curious students not only ask questions, but also actively seek out the answers. Without curiosity, Sir Isaac Newton would have never formulated the laws of physics, Alexander Fleming probably wouldn't have discovered penicillin, and Marie Curie's pioneering research on radioactivity may not exist. Research has even shown that curiosity is just as important as intelligence in determining how well students do in school.

So what can you do to encourage the disposition of curiosity in your child?

Be a good role model. Whenever a question pops into your head, ask it out loud. "I wonder what makes this spaghetti sauce taste so good?" "Why was there hail in that thunderstorm?" "What makes the dog get so excited after a bath?" Then, together with your children, try to find the answers.

Answer questions. It's true; sometimes you simply don't have time to answer every single question your child has for you. But don't get into the habit of replying with a non-answer like "Because I said so" or "That's just the way things are." Give your child an answer or explanation whenever possible, and try to engage him in discussion afterward. If you don't have an answer, try responding with something like, "Actually, I don't know the answer to that. Let's try to find one together. Where do you think we should start?" You don't want your child to learn that his curiosity will never be rewarded!

Don't micromanage. Let your child engage in open-ended play. Don't always tell her *how* to do something (e.g., "Color only in this direction," or, "Here's what you need to do to build a fort underneath the kitchen table"). Let her figure things out for herself. Often, you'll be pleasantly surprised—or even amazed—by the results.

Give your child tools. Give your kids the ability to pursue the things they're curious about on their own. When it's age appropriate, teach them how to use Internet searches (perhaps with parental controls in place) and libraries. Try to help them build a good home library, too, because you never know when a question about outer space, insects, or ancient Rome will pop up!

Banish "boring." In other words, cut the "B-word" out of your vocabulary. Don't label activities or situations as "boring," because you don't want your child to think that boredom is okay. Instead, encourage your child to *find* something interesting if he isn't stimulated. Curious people are never bored because they have the ability to look around and ask questions: "Why is this the way it is? How did it get that way? What can it tell me about the world?"

Bridging through Art: A Creative Transition program for Grade 6 students

We are excited to provide grade 6 students with the opportunity to engage in a creative arts-based program designed to help them navigate the transition from primary school into high school. Spread across three sessions - past, present, and future - the program is designed to encourage students to reflect on their primary school experience, explore their present feelings, and envision the high school experience they would like to have. The aim of the program is focussed on providing the means for developing emotional expression, personal empowerment, and sense of direction.

The 'Bridging through Art' program is comprised of three sessions which will occur:

Dates: Term 3 & Term 4 **Time:** After school hours

Cost: \$150 per student to cover all three sessions, art materials, and guided instruction

Sessions are facilitated by Noor Shehabi, a registered psychologist with specialised training in art therapy and experience working in the primary school sector. The program is open to any Grade 6 students that are beginning high school in 2019 (numbers are limited).


