*At OLMC we are focussing on 8 learning dispositions. Learning dispositions are attitudes to learning or ways of thinking about learning. Our dispositions are:
self motivation, creativity,
determination, curiosity, collaboration, making
connections, reflection and risk taking.*

A learner who shows creativity ...
thinks 'outside the box'
tries different ways to solve a problem
approaches and presents their learning
in unique ways



Definitions of creativity are not straightforward, and many writers have contributed to the debate about what constitutes creativity, often hotly contesting different views. However, most theorists agree that the creative process involves a number of components, most commonly: imagination, originality (the ability to come up with ideas and products that are new and unusual), productivity (the ability to generate a variety of different ideas through divergent thinking), problem solving (application of knowledge and imagination to a given situation) and the ability to produce an outcome of value and worth.

Why...

The right mix of creativity along with curriculum helps students to be innovative and also encourages them to learn new things. **It enhances thinking capability, boosts problem solving skills and promotes an innovative mindset.**

During a TED talk, Sir Ken Robinson raised the utmost significance of creativity in today's education when he told "Creativity now is as important in education as literacy, and we should treat it with the same status."

So what can you do to encourage the disposition of creativity in your child?

- * Provide open-ended play opportunities and props
 - * Whenever possible, honor children's unique ideas; don't require conformity
 - * Support children in following through on own ideas
 - * Model doing new and different things with common objects
 - * Encourage children to develop different uses for familiar objects
 - * Provide blank paper and mixed media for art
 - * Sing a familiar song, allow children to share ideas for new lyrics
 - * Invite children to create their own ending to a story or movie.
