Enrolment Process

To make a booking simply enroll online and once you have entered all your details you can book the sessions you need. You will need a valid credit card or bank account for direct debit. Once you are enrolled most of your bookings should be made online. Online bookings can be made up until the day before the session you are trying to book. To book a session on the same day as the session, please call your program coordinator or the Customer Service and Billing Team on 1300 395 735.

Medical Information

If your child requires an Epi-pen, please make sure the Epi-pen is stored at the service. If you would like a copy of JAG's Anaphylaxis Policy, please feel free to ask the Coordinator.
