Believe it or not it is that time of year again where we start to plan for next year. If you have any concerns please send me an email or pop in and see me. I ask that if you speak to your child's teacher about next year, please speak to me or email me as well. This is not about 'teacher shopping' or discrimination against other students. If you have special requests we will do our best to accommodate them, if they are reasonable. However, I have 290 students to think about.

Please also consider that there will be some changes in staffing next year. Some teachers have been in their year level for some time and have requested a change, which is good for them professionally. Primary teachers are trained to teach anywhere from Prep to Year 6 and sometimes up to year 10. Next year we will have a different structure to our classes:

- * 2 x Prep classes
- * 2 x Year 1 classes
- * 2 x Year 2 classes
- * 3 x Year 3/4 classes
- 3 x 5/6 classes

There are several reasons for this and we believe it is what is best for our students academically and socially. It is intended that this will be the structure for the foreseeable future.

The SRC have organised a Pyjama Day for the last day of term – Friday 21st September. Children are encouraged to wear their pyjamas to school and donate a gold coin to the Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday appeal. You will receive a flyer from the SRC next week.

Next term we will have a whole school athletics day for the first time in a number of years. In order for this to be a success, we will require many parent helpers. I will confirm the date next week and ask for volunteers.

Speaking of volunteers, we will also need someone (or a group of people) to run the Bunnings BBQ next year. Narelle Coughlan has done a wonderful job but this is her last year at OLMC. The Bunnings BBQ is a great event and a major fundraiser so please consider putting up your hand. Speak to Narelle or to me for further information.

They had interesting costumes. My favourite costume was the soldier because Simon had a mouse on each shoulder. He also had a sword.


They sang instead of talking. I liked it. At the end they signed their names in Auslan.
