Dear Parents,

Thank you to the parents who attended the fundraising and community meeting on Tuesday night. I appreciate the time you gave and the robust discussion. Thank you also to those who contacted me to say they couldn't make it but would love to be part of the plans this year. The group came up with some wonderful ideas which I will mention below. These events cannot happen without your help. Please have a look and see what you could help out with. If you have any further ideas please let me know.

It is essential that the lines of communication are open between school and home. We have various of ways of communicating with you, such as the newsletter, Flexi Buzz and See Saw. Email is also a great way to communicate. If the matter is urgent, please ring the school. If you email a teacher, please allow 24-48 hours for a response. Teachers are not expected to check and respond to emails on the weekend or late at night.

As part of our uniform guidelines, hair that is shoulder length or longer needs to be tied back. This is for boys and girls. Hair should be kept neat and tidy with no shaved patterns. I would appreciate it if you spoke to your child in regard to this and I will be following it up at school. I have a stash of hair ties in my office if required. Please note that nail polish is banned and jewellery is to be kept to a watch, studs or sleepers, and necklaces only for religious reasons. Bracelets are not permitted. Fitness trackers are fine but are the responsibility of the student. Hair accessories must be green or white, yellow is allowed with the sports uniform. Thank you for support in this matter.

The Colour Run is next Friday 1st March. So far 92 students have registered and 51 are raising money. We have 283 students in the school so we have many students still to get on board. Please do so as soon as you can. Those 51 are doing a fabulous job but they need your help.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY


New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
