Yesterday was Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. All students from year three to year six attended our Eucharistic celebration and were marked with the cross of ashes. We receive them on our foreheads as a sign that we want to turn away from sin, and to follow Jesus. Ash Wednesday begins the forty day season of Lent that leads to Easter. On Ash Wednesday, we come together to remind ourselves that we don't always follow God's ways and need to ask God for His mercy and forgiveness. It is a time to think about how we can become more like God.

Student Free Day This is what our Lord asks of us: To act justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with our God.

(Micah 6, v8) This is foremost in our mind in our interactions with colleagues, parents and students. We use a Restorative Practices approach which is very common in Catholic schools, as well as many government and independent school around the world. Throughout this year we will be revisiting this approach with teachers, students and parents. There will be a parent information evening later in the year with a guest speaker. This is not a new approach. Staff at OLMC were trained in Restorative Practices well before I came on board.

A commitment to Restorative Practices aims to promote resilience. Restorative measures help students learn from their mistakes, grow in self discipline, take responsibility for their actions, recognise the impact of their actions on others, and reconcile and resolve conflict with others. Put simply, the restorative practice framework is a process for forming effective relationships and a way of restoring them when they break down. It is not about punishment and retribution, although there are still consequences for hurting others. The focus is on restoring the relationship, not about paying back or punishment.

Over the next few weeks I will share more information with you about the Restorative Practices approach. It is important to note that all children make mistakes and don't always make the right decisions. One of the worst things we can do as parents is to stick our head in the sand and believe that our child will never get frustrated, will never hit out, will never speak unkindly. We are all human and the important thing is that we learn from our mistakes. Please note that if a child makes the wrong choice, consequences will be in place but will not be made public. Do not approach the parent of another child. Encourage your child to speak to a teacher any time they have been hurt. It is essential that we are all on the same page with this.

Congratulations to the children who represented our school on Tuesday at the Divisional Swimming Carnival. Alex Fish finished 2nd in the 12/13 year old boys backstroke, Keira Wilson finished 4th in the girls 11 year old backstroke, Amelia Haxby finished 2nd in the 10 year old girls butterfly and our 11 year old girls relay team (Keira Wilson, Alyssa Phillips, Isla Lavelle and Amelia Haxby) finished 3rd in their event. We are very proud of you all.

A reminder to keep the Colour Run donations coming in and to order some delicious Hot Cross Buns. I look forward to seeing many of you at our school picnic on the 29th March. Thank you to the wonderful parents who have put their hand up to help with these events.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY


New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
