Dear Parents,

Congratulations to the year 6 students who received the Sacrament of Confirmation on Sunday at St Patrick's Cathedral. Confirmation is the sacrament by which we receive a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Through Confirmation, the Holy Spirit gives us the increased ability to practise our Catholic faith in every aspect of our lives and to witness Christ in every situation. Thank you to all the families for your support in nurturing your child's faith. Thank you to all our staff who attended each Mass and especially Francesca Rizzo, Bec McCabe, Shelley Ellis, Evelyn Sfyris, Kate Faulkner, Colin Healy and Nelson Graham for the work done at school level.

Take a close look at this image of an iceberg. The part of the iceberg on top of the water is what you see at school on a daily basis. The enormous part under the water is what takes place to make it all happen. This time of year is an even greater example of how this works in a school. I have been meeting with all staff members about individual and school level goals and challenges. With the SRC and Advisory Board we have discussed the value of our specialist programs. With all of this information I am now thinking about which



teacher to place in each grade level. I will take into account the teacher's experience across the school and the particular needs of all students. As you can imagine this is a massive task. I also take into account discussions I have had with parents and what I know to be right for the students. The final thing that needs to be taken into account is how much money we receive for staffing. Each school receives a set amount according to the exact number of students enrolled in the school. This is called Global Budgeting and from there I make decisions around priorities for our students. While some things are nice to have, if there are more pressing priorities and it doesn't fit into the budget, then we have to say no. Unfortunately there is not a bottomless pit of money so we do the very best we can.

I would like to share the first few decisions that have been made for 2020. First of all, the structure of the classes will be as follows:

This will stretch our budget as we are really covered for approximately 25 students in each class and the lower classes will have smaller numbers. We will be limited for classroom space and will need to move the library. Stay tuned for a call out for helpers.

Secondly, there will be some changes to our specialist program. This has not yet been finalized but at this stage the program will include Physical Education, Visual Arts, Japanese, Auslan, Science and Technology. What this will look like is yet to be finalized but as soon as it is, I will let you know. There will be no formal specialist Performing Arts program next year but we are looking at ways to ensure the students are still exposed to and able to participate in drama, dance and song. As you would be aware, none of these decisions are made lightly. There has been much discussion and lots of sleepless nights!

Next year our school will turn 160 years old. We will celebrate with Mass and a gathering on the 19<sup>th</sup> April. We would love some parents to join the organizing committee. Please let me know if you can help as we will need to start booking rides and food trucks as well as sending out invitations.

Congratulations to Liam Joyce in Year 3 who competed at the State Athletics Carnival. Liam finished 10<sup>th</sup> in the Long Jump and 12th in the 100 metres. This is a huge feat and we are very proud of him

We had our first prep orientation session this morning. There are many siblings in the group but we will also welcome many new families to OLMC in 2020. The white shirt for the boys will be compulsory next year and phased in for everyone else over the next two years.


