Gospel Mark 14:1–15:47

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.

During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. These may be returned to the church, or kept for the year. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect.

Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday. The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

A reminder that tomorrow is a school closure day. There is no school for the students. Staff will be onsite preparing for our school review.

PEACEFUL KIDS PROGRAM

The Peaceful Kids Program is an 8 week evidence based program for a small group of 4-6 primary school aged children. (8 - 12 years)

A group of selected children participate each week for approximately 1 hour.

Sessions are facilitated and children learn a range of mindfulness strategies as well as meditations and positive psychology exercises.

They work through many different activities each week and are also provided with links to information and specialised mindfulness activities and meditations to practice at home.

PROGRAM CONTENT

During the 8 week program some of the children will learn:

- Basic theory on Mindfulness and how it affects the brain
- Different ways to practice and integrate mindfulness into their lives
- How their feelings relate to anxiety and stress levels
- How to understand anxiety and how it relates to them personally
- Understanding triggers of stress and how to calm down when feeling this way
- Different types of thinking that increase or lessen anxiety
- Creating a balanced lifestyle including chill out time and being in the flow.
