Dear Parents,

Next week we have our school review process happening on Tuesday and Thursday. On these days an external reviewer (Christine Wakeling) will visit the school and talk to staff, students and parents. In preparation for this day, the staff had to prepare a School Improvement rubric where we evaluated and reflected upon our practices in the areas of Student Wellbeing, Religious Education, Learning and Teaching, Leadership and Management and School Community. The reviewer will then provide feedback to us as well as recommendations as we begin to plan our next 4 year cycle. Every Catholic school in the Melbourne Archdiocese participates in this process.

Last term I met with the Christine Wakeling to look at our documentation to ensure we are compliant with the VRQA (Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority). There is a great deal of work that has been done behind the scenes to ensure everything is up to date and compliant.

Please keep Paula Seric in your prayers. Paula is on leave for the duration of this term to care for her husband who is unwell. We extend our deepest condolences to the family Zac and Jaiden Paoly (year 6) on the loss of their Nonna and Ronnie's mum this week.

Please keep the Colour Run registrations and donations coming in. We aim to raise at least \$10000 to put towards the beautification of our gardens and creating outdoor learning spaces.

There are some children who are not wearing the correct school uniform. A reminder that white socks only are to be worn with the sports uniform, not black and no logos please. If your child is not wearing the correct uniform expect a note from their teacher following this up. There seems to be some confusion around what constitutes school shoes v runners. Please see me if you are not sure. Runners are only to be worn on sports days. Hair accessories are to be bottle green, yellow or white. Nail polish is not permitted. Hair that is shoulder length or longer needs to be tied up for health and safety reasons. Jewellery is limited to small earrings and a watch. Religious medallions may be worn on a chain and tucked in. We discourage anything expensive being brought or worn to school.






First round interviews for Year 7 2023 places will be conducted in early September and offers will go out in October. An interview booking link will be supplied to all applicants soon after the closing date.



PEACEFUL KIDS PROGRAM

The Peaceful Kids Program is an 8 week evidence based program for a small group of 4-6 primary school aged children. (8 - 12 years)

A group of selected children participate each week for approximately 1 hour. Sessions are facilitated and children learn a range of mindfulness strategies as well as meditations and positive psychology exercises.

They work through many different activities each week and are also provided with links to information and specialised mindfulness activities and meditations to practice at home.

PROGRAM CONTENT

During the 8 week program some of the children will learn:

- Basic theory on Mindfulness and how it affects the brain
- Different ways to practice and integrate mindfulness into their lives
- How their feelings relate to anxiety and stress levels
- How to understand anxiety and how it relates to them personally
- Understanding triggers of stress and how to calm down when feeling this way
- Different types of thinking that increase or lessen anxiety
 - Creating a balanced lifestyle including chill out time and being in the flow.


