Dear Parents,

Can you believe that term 3 is drawing to a close? I would really like to thank all of our students for the courage and resilience they have continued to show throughout the term. I have really enjoyed seeing everyone at the various Google Meets I have attended. A huge thank you also to our parents and staff who have supported the children all the way. I know it hasn't been easy and I understand the different concerns, whether they be around mental health, socialisation or academic progress.

The US Open was a great example of hope and resilience. Emma Raducanu started the tournament as a qualifier, ranked 150 in the world. She went through to win without dropping a set. Last year when London was in lock down and Emma was unable to train at her courts, she practised every day at home, hitting the ball for hours every day. Dylan Alcott is also a wonderful example, winning the Golden slam, all Grand Slam tournaments and the Gold Medal at the Olympics. He was born with a tumour wrapped around his spinal cord which was operated on during the first few weeks of his life. The tumour was successfully cut out; however, it left him a paraplegic, requiring him to use a wheelchair. It is amazing what we can achieve with the right mind set and positive self talk. This is a great lesson for all of us.

As soon as I know when and how we will return to onsite learning, I will contact all families. There may be a staggered start, we may be back to using specific gates, or there may be a whole new approach. I know as much (or as little) as you do. What I do know is that the key for us all to return to school is vaccination. If you haven't already done so, please consider getting vaccinated to protect yourself, your children and the vulnerable. There will be further information coming our regarding the vaccination of children. I don't know what this will look like just yet but I will pass on any information I receive.

Although it is only September, plans for 2022 are well underway. The first exciting news we have is the change to our Deputy Principal role. Next year we will have 2 Deputy Principals. Mark Gleeson will hold the role of Deputy Principal: Organisation and Technology. Mark will continue to look after the daily running of the school including timetables and relief teachers, as well as everything Google, Seesaw, reports and computers. Mark already does a wonderful job in this area and will continue to do this next year.

We have a new role for 2022 which is Deputy Principal: Faith and Mission, which is a combination of what we currently call the Religious Education Leader as well as looking after school community and part of our Life and Faith curriculum. We are very excited to announce that Nelson Graham will be joining our staff and taking up this new position. Further staffing and structure announcements will be made in term 4.

At the end of the term we farewell two of our wonderful families who are moving to different parts of Victoria to start a new chapter in their lives. Bailee and Blake Warton and Harry Cronk, we will miss you and your families and we wish you all the very best. Earlier this term we farewelled Addisyn McNamara who also have an exciting adventure ahead of her. I thank all 3 families for the contributions they have made to OLMC.


