Dear Parents,

We are busily preparing for the students to begin their transition back to school. As I am sure you can imagine, there is a lot to juggle around timetabling and rostering of staff each day. However, we have done it before and we will do it again to the very best of our ability. On Tuesday afternoon we had a guest speaker at our staff meeting and one of the things we discussed was being mindful of our own and others' 'Window of Tolerance'.

Last weekend I sent out an email and Seesaw post regarding information for returning to school. Please make sure you read this in detail as it will answer most of your questions.

#### Here are the main points:

- The transition back to school starts Monday 18<sup>th</sup> October for the Prep
- Please see the table below for all of the important dates
- Remote learning will continue for the days classes are not onsite
- Onsite supervision will continue for those children who have been eligible during this lockdown
- All children who at school must wear their full Summer uniform, including their hat
- All students from year 3 must wear a mask inside unless they have a medical exemption sighted by Mark Gleeson or myself
- Preps will use the Oshclub gate for drop off and pick up
- You may use the gate most appropriate for you to drop off and pick up students in Years 1-6. Please let your child know where to meet you
- Drop off for all students is from 8:30am and students must be collected by 3:30. If your children are here outside of these hours, they need to be booked into Oshclub
- Please ensure you adhere to social distancing at drop off and pick up and keep the footpaths clear
- Parents and other visitors are not allowed onsite unless it is an emergency
- Parents may enter the office foyer if really necessary (e.g. to sign children in or out, to pay fees, other queries that cannot be answered via phone or email) but will need to sign in via the QR code
- Assemblies will continue online at 9am on Monday mornings
- Covid safe protocols such as social distancing and hand sanitising will be enforced at school



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We really appreciate you cooperation in all of this so that can have all staff and students back onsite for the remainder of the year. There is a chance that once everyone returns we may have a case of Covid at the school. If this does happen we will follow the directives of DHHS and I will keep you updated on closures, etc.

With all this happening, I am also starting to think about 2022. If you know your children are not returning next year please let me know as soon as possible so that we can make decisions about staffing and class structures.
