A few weeks ago, I made mention of some great achievements by past OLMC students. I heard some more great news from Salesian College this week that Claire D'Couto was the year 8 Student of the Term recipient. Congratulations, Claire. We are very proud of you.

As I have mentioned, under the new MACs governance we are required to establish a new School Advisory Council for 2022. Please consider sending me an expression of interest to join the council. It is a great way to become involved in the school and to have the ability to work with me, and the rest of the leadership team, as we make plans for our school community. A short email is all that is needed.

This week we welcomed our 2022 class of preps for their first orientation session. It was lovely to see how excited they were to be here and how well they settled in for the hour. The new preps will have another 3 orientation sessions to help them become familiar with the school and at the next session they will meet the 2022 prep teachers!



It has been so exciting getting everyone back to school over the past couple of weeks. We are doing everything we can to minimise the risk of Covid infections within in the school, including the wearing of masks indoors, opening windows and doors, social distancing and keeping the classes in bubbles. It is essential that everyone plays their part. Most of the schools in Sunbury have now had classes and staff in isolation.

Something else that is exciting is making plans for 2022. Each year, as a leadership team and then a whole staff, we look at our enrolment numbers across the school to determine the class structures the following year. My ability to employ and allocate staff relies solely on the funding we receive which is based on the number of enrolments. For many reasons, including a number of families moving overseas and interstate, our numbers are quite a bit higher in years 4, 5 and 6. If we keep the current class structures, we would have 32 students in each of our 5/6 classes, which is above the number permitted and not equitable when there are class sizes of 16 further down the school.

We do not have enough enrolments to employ an extra teacher and we also do not have another room to be used as a classroom. There are so many factors to take into account. We have juggled the numbers to find the best scenario and as a result we will move to the following structure:



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2 x prep classes 3 x 3/4 classes

2 x year 1 classes 2 x year 5 classes

2 x year 2 classes 2 x year 6 classes.

We also want to ensure that classes within a level are located together in the same part of the school. This means some classes will be in different areas of the school next year. We will let you know once this is all confirmed. I know there are some parents who are concerned with composite classes. I spent almost all of my 25 years of teaching in multi age or composite classes. As we use student data to inform our teaching and to plan learning, for us it is less about that year level the child is in and more about teaching them to their point of need. We have had composite classes at OLMC for many, many years, across various levels.

While I have had some conversations and emails with parents regarding considerations for placing children in classes for next year, please be aware that the teachers make the final decisions, based on what is best for each child. Sometimes being with your best friend is not best for your learning. It is also important that to note that we do not accept 'teacher shopping'. Sometimes there are good reasons a child should or should not be with a particular teacher. One child's experience with a particular teacher can also be very different for another child. It is a huge jigsaw puzzle for us to put together so, while we will do our very best please be aware it is not possible to accommodate every single consideration.

Sunbury Catholic Parish School Fee Policy for our Parish Primary Schools

There are now three primary schools in the Parish of Our Lady of Mt Carmel. The Parish established the first two schools through the generosity of parishioners, and their continued support enables the Parish to sustain pastoral and financial assistance to our whole school community.

2022 School Fee Structure & Schedule Family Fee cost \$2270.00

In order to support our families during the COVID-19 pandemic there was no increase of School fees for 2021, and so we have not been able to avoid a small increase for 2022 to \$2270.

This fee is charged annually per family. Billing is done at the start of the year for the full year and this account is required to be paid in full by the end of July. Payment may be made by Cash, Cheque, Credit Card or Direct Debit. Payment by instalment can be arranged with the office before the end of February.

Per Student Fee cost - \$360.00

In order to support our families during these difficult times we have not made any change to the Curriculum Levies charged for 2022. Each student is charged a curriculum levy in November/December \$360 for 2022. This fee must be paid mid December 2021 so that resources can be purchased and distributed. There are additional costs for Sacramental classes (charged by the Parish) and school camps (usually Years 3-6). Interschool Sports can be an additional charge (Years 5 & 6) notified at the time.

One to one Laptop Program Year 5 & 6 Students only

Every student in year 5 and 6 has the opportunity to participate in a one to one laptop program, whereby all students are allocated an Apple Mac Laptop for their use at School and also at home (with controls) and Parents are billed (with school fees) for the rent of the machine whilst at OLMC in years 5 and 6. The cost for 2022 for the Laptop rental is \$490 for year 6 students and \$463 for year 5 students. At the end of Year 6 each family has the option to purchase the Laptop their child has been using for an extra buyout fee.

The three primary schools of Our Lady of Mt Carmel Parish receive limited funding from government sources. Parents who choose to send their children to our Parish Primary Schools are therefore obliged to pay school fees in order for the schools to repay loans, running costs, salaries and educational requirements. Parents will also be expected to participate in and support fundraising activities, which assists in the areas of maintenance, playground amenities and additional resources in curriculum.

It is a matter of justice that all parents are meeting their obligation and therefore the school fee policy has been developed to assist all parents.

Process for Collection of Fees

- At the end of previous year, the school will inform parents of the fees, when due and payment options. Payments are
 to be made by the due date.
- If there is a difficulty with fees at any stage, onus is on parents to communicate with school and contact the Principal
 who can negotiate a reasonable fee depending on circumstances. Also, some people, for budget purposes, need to pay
 weekly, fortnightly or monthly. The school can accommodate time payment plans, but requests are to be made at the
 beginning of the year.
- Parents will be issued an account as shown below, and reminders throughout the year

*Unless payment plan is in place.

- 4. If full amount is not received by the end of July, an Account Rendered is sent as a reminder.
- One week later the Principal (or an agent of the Principal), will contact the parents. Arrangements are to be kept confidential between all parties.
- 6. If the agreed course of action is not implemented, a final letter will be sent one week later informing parents that the matter has been passed on to the Debt Collection Agency / Legal Team. In the event that the customer is in default of the obligation to pay, and the overdue account is then referred to an agency for collection, the commission payable and legal costs incurred shall be added to the amount outstanding and form part of the debt.
- The Principal is to follow up the matter with the Agency. This will take place at various times during the year.


