#### **Gospel Reflections**



Call it coincidence, call it fate or call it the Holy Spirit at work, but as mentioned before, our whole school liturgy on the Green on Friday happens to link with our Gospel reading this Sunday. It is the one where Jesus shares his sermon on the mountain. We probably know it better as the Beatitudes. In teaching his disciples and those around him, Jesus hands down eight ways to live our lives so that we might bring about the Kingdom of God:

Blessed are the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the hungry, those who weep, those who are hated, who are excluded, reviled and defamed because of their belief in God. Jesus teaches that the Kingdom of God is already theirs!

This way to live points us towards God, and God's Kingdom, but what is this Kingdom that Jesus speaks of? You see, Jesus came to earth to teach about God's Kingdom as not being a place that exists in a supernatural place, but instead in the present. In the here and now, but not fully. The Beatitudes give us the blue-prints, the secret herbs and spices if you like, on how we can bring God's Kingdom to all those we meet, so that we might be prepared for when Jesus comes again.

It's interesting when we reflect on the Beatitudes, whilst we have these ways to go about our lives, all the teachings still revolve around Jesus' one commandment. The greatest commandment: to love one another as Jesus loves us. Not always easy, not always practical and not always 'the done thing'! However, in our week ahead might we turn to the Beatitudes to consider how simple acts of humility, kindness and vulnerability inspire us to exhibit this unconditional love that Jesus speaks of, so that we might bring the Kingdom of God to live in this world of ours.
