Welcome back to the new school year! It is great to be back and the children and staff have returned very refreshed and with a positive mindset. There were no tears in prep and they have settled in beautifully already. The start of a school year can be challenging as students navigate different class groups and teachers, so please give your child time to settle back into the school routines before becoming too concerned. Some friendships can change as well. How we respond to our children when they come home with concerns is vital to how they will be able to deal with the situation. You will have the opportunity to meet with your child's teacher in week 3. Booking details will be released soon.

This year, we are taking on The Resilience Project and the students will participate in sessions each week based on gratitude, kindness, empathy and emotional literacy. They will each have their own journal to record their thoughts and feelings and I hope they come home and talk to you about their experiences. We will involve the parents so look out for more information.

Welcome to our new families who have started at OLMC this year. We have 32 prep students and another 16 students across the school who have joined us. We welcome you to our school community and look forward to working in partnership with you.

I have sent out a great deal of information to you over the past week or so. Please keep up to date as things change very quickly when it comes to Covid and we want to ensure that we minimise risk as much as we can. If you do not yet have access to Seesaw please contact your child's teacher. Teacher email addresses were sent to all parents of students in years 1-6 when I emailed you about your child's appointment time for Monday. Communication between home and school is vital. I use both email and Seesaw so please let me know if your email address has changed.

A reminder that you need to contact the school if your child is absent for any reason. You can call the school on 97407344 or send an email or Seesaw message to your child's teacher. Please include your child's name, class, date of absence and the reason. We are mandated to follow up on any unexplained absences.

I will continue to inform the school community of any Covid cases within the school. So far our community has been very supportive and I really appreciate everyone's concerns and offers of help. Our community is also been very mindful of people's privacy and I thank everyone for your part in this.

Please ensure you keep on top of school dates. I sent you a copy of the 2022 dates that we have so far and they are also in the newsletter for the weeks ahead. These include school closure and Sacramental dates.

I have emailed you the protocols of what to do if your child tests positive for Covid. You are welcome to email me after hours to inform me of a case. That way I can send out information to families before school and give you the opportunity to monitor for symptoms and use the Rapid Antigen Tests. If your child does have symptoms and is unwell but tests negative, they should not be at school as they need to rest and recuperate.

Unfortunately we have had to change our Opening School Mass to a liturgy on the green as we can gather briefly outside. We will present School Captain badges at this liturgy.

Gospel Reflections

It seems as though it were like yesterday that we were preparing to celebrate Christmas, but we now find ourselves already into the new Liturgical Year at the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In Luke's Gospel reading from this coming Sunday, we hear of the story where Jesus, standing by the lake, gets sight of two men, his soon-to-be disciples, who are fishing. After spending some time teaching the crowds, he then sailed out with the fishermen. Weary, two men had been out all night trying to catch fish, and much like most



of my attempts as a fisherman, had struggled to catch anything. Jesus then told them to throw their nets into the water in a different part of the lake, where it was a little deeper. Exhausted and reluctant to do so, the men followed Jesus' instructions. To their amazement, as they pulled in their nets, it overflowed with fish (no fishing licences were needed in those days!), more than they could haul into their own boat. They had to call their friends to help them bring it in! Astounded in the presence of Jesus, the man who we now know as Simon Peter, (yes, that same Simon Peter who denies Jesus three times) does not feel worthy enough to be anywhere near Jesus. Jesus, knowing the work that he was sent to do, sensed Simon Peter's fear and reassured him that from then on, he would no longer be catching fish, but people instead. Immediately, Simon Peter left everything he knew and followed Jesus. This was the beginning of something new!

When I hear this story, I know that it's something that happened thousands of years ago, but it's so uncanny how much this story reminds me of what's happening in our world today. Well before 2020 happened, many of us found ourselves in regular routines, doing things only in the ways we were used to, only for it to be shaken up with the uncertainty of the pandemic. After spending a tedious night fishing in the same way they always did, the disciples, empowered by Jesus, changed their approach, resulting in an abundance of fish.

This makes me wonder, what things are we still stuck doing in the same old way, and is that way still bringing us success? What do we need to do to approach our lives from a different perspective? Who is the Jesus-like figure in our lives who points towards a more prosperous future?

Jesus tells Simon Peter that from then on, he would be 'catching people' instead. As we head into the second month of this new year, a new beginning for all of us awaits. Let's ask ourselves, what small changes can we make to take on the challenges our world continues to throw our way? Ultimately, what are the small and simple things we can do to make a positive difference to the lives of our families, friends and loved ones?
