In 2020, the State Government introduced a Mobile Phone Policy for Schools, where students are not to use their phone at school. While we do have the policy in place, we have had very few issues. The policy has recently been updated to include other devices. The policy can be found on the school website. Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored in their bag or at the school office during school hours. Students are encouraged to leave Smartwatches at home and wear these outside school hours.

Mobile phones or other smart devices are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/guardian's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Our Lady of Mount Carmel Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/guardians are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items.

Recently, we have had issues with Smart watches and similar devices where text messages and calls can be made and received and photos and videos can be taken, which come under the same category as mobile phones. While I will not enforce a ban on the watches at this stage, children are not to use them as a phone or camera at school. If this is occurring the watch will be confiscated and you will be asked to come to the school to collect it. They are unnecessary for primary school aged children and can cause significant harm.



## Our Catholic Identity

Happy St Patrick's Day! Today we celebrate this day, which originally started in Ireland as a religious holiday, but over time has become a cultural celebration all around the world where Irish-Catholics took their faith and belief in God. We in Melbourne owe a lot the Irish-Catholics who brought with them Catholicism. Such is the case that in the city, the early Irish-Catholics built our Cathedral, and fittingly named it after St Patrick.



Whilst St Patrick is attributed to Ireland, he actually was British and at the age of about 16, was taken to Ireland to become a slave. After being freed he became a priest and later on became the first bishop of Ireland. Patrick is attributed with bringing Christianity to Ireland. Now whilst we often see St Patrick wearing green, and the day linked to the same colour, St Patrick actually wore blue, the traditional colour of the early Irish-Catholics. However, the colour green became more connected to St Patrick due to the lush greenery of Ireland in the three-leafed clover...oh, and mythical leprechauns! A Shamrock- Irish three-leafed clover, is probably more synonymous with St Patrick's Day is a symbol of faith, hope and love and possibly used by St Patrick to teach about the Holy Trinity. Lots of luck is to come your way if you find a clover with four leaves!

Coinciding with this celebration of the St Patrick's Day is the celebration of Catholic Education Week. A time in our Archdiocese where we celebrate the gift of Catholic Education! Catholic schooling first began in Melbourne in 1840, and our very own school was established in 1860, with only 32 students! It wasn't till 1916, in the middle of the First World War that the Sisters of St Joseph arrived in Sunbury and we adopted the Josephite charism that we hold true today. On Saturday we celebrate the Feast of St Joseph!

There is much to celebrate in this Catholic Education Week, and taking our lead from Archbishop Peter, we are inspired to *"Take the Way of the Gospel!"* It is a challenge to us all to find the living Christ in the ordinary aspects of our lives, and to consider how the teachings of Christ might inspire all of us to bring Jesus alive in our school community and beyond!

### Gospel Reflections

Our third Sunday of Lent brings us the parable that Jesus tells in a call to his listeners to repent and turn away from wrongdoing and sin. It's the one where a man who had a fig tree in his vineyard came looking for fruit on it and was disappointed to find none. He was about to cut it down when the caretaker of the vineyard begged of him to give the tree one more year, and in that year, he promised to tend to the ground attentively by fertilising and watering it. If it did not give fruit after that, then he could cut it down.

I can't help but think of my poor old lemon tree I planted at home many years ago. It struggled for a long time, and I was quite sad that there were no lemons after several years of growth. I didn't give up on that tree, but instead found the right fertiliser for the soil it was in, and watered it generously. Of course with extra care and attention to the foundation, this forlorn lemon tree gave us, and continues to provide juicy lemons! Sometimes when relationships, school, work and life in general doesn't seem to be fully flourishing, this parable in the Season of Lent serves as a timely reminder of the dedication, care and nurturing we need to lovingly apply the 'fertilise' those things in our lives that are not producing 'fruit'. So poetically, this story from Jesus hits home the message of Lent to not to simply 'Give Up, but to Give More!'

May this Season of Lent be an opportunity to tend lovingly to the challenges we face in our lives.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

**TO BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE THE CSEF FUND PAYMENTS PARENTS MUST BE THE HOLDER OF A GOVERNMENT CONCESSION CARD. CONTACT THE SCHOOL OFFICE FOR MORE DETAILS**

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

I understand that:

- DFFH will use information I have provided to DET to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DET personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.
- this consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.
- I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DFFH and provide it to DET so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund can be determined.
- if I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DET.
- Information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to the DFFH and /or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.

You are able to request access to the personal information that we hold about you, and to request that any errors be corrected, by contacting your child's school.

## CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

### Criteria 1 – General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one
  - on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards **OR** be a temporary foster parent and;
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy:

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

### Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

### Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (31 January 2022) or term two (26 April 2022).

## PAYMENT AMOUNTS

### CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

**Year 7 government school students** who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

## HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2022 closes on the 24 June 2022.


