# This Sunday is the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent. Easter is almost upon us.

John 8:1-11 - This story tells us about people who came to Jesus with different mindsets. The Pharisees and scribes were sure they were right and the woman knew that she had done wrong. The effect of meeting Jesus and letting Him into their lives changes them powerfully. The Pharisees and scribes, through the words of Jesus were able to see that they too were sinners, like the woman they were accusing and they were not perfect. The woman, expecting to be punished for her error, received a lovely acceptance from Jesus which must have left a lasting impression on her.

When someone has done the wrong thing by us how do we react? Do we forgive or seek retribution? Lent is the perfect time to reflect on where we sit with this question. It is also worth asking, "What would Jesus do?" At OLMC we use the restorative practices approach where we seek to reflect on our actions and repair damaged relationships. While there are always consequences for our actions, it is important to also seek understanding.

Gospel Reflections



This week's Sunday Gospel moves away from our liturgical year author-Luke, and shifts to John. The Gospel according to John is quite different to the other three Gospels, as it is not synoptic, but rather often referred to as the 'Spiritual Gospel'. In Sunday's reading, we have the story of the interaction Jesus has with a woman who had done many wrong things, and was condemned to a punishment by the male-dominant society that she lived in. According to the people who brought the woman to Jesus, the punishment was what she 'deserved' according to the Law of Moses, which the Jewish people follow. Jesus, seemingly unphased by the people and their demands to have the woman stoned, drew in the dirt with his finger, and looking up at them challenged them saying, whoever was without sin could throw the first stone. Continuing to write in the dirt, the men left, one-by-one, with not one person throwing a single stone. When Jesus looked up, seeing nobody there, he turned to the woman

telling her that since nobody condemned her, nor did he! He sent her on and told her to sin no more!

The phrase that Jesus challenges the crowd with is quite a popular and colloquialised saying: "He who is without sin shall cast the first stone!" It's a challenge, but almost a rhetoric one at that! Jesus was well aware that not one of the people who had written this woman off was sinless. Neither are we! There are many great things that each of us do to live a life in one and other's favour, however, there are times when we mess up, or miss the mark! We know what we need to do, and how we need to do it, but unfortunately we make the wrong choices! It is this recognition that each of us are imperfect that often can be the difference between accepting or rejecting others. In mending and further strengthening the relationships we have with our families and friends, might this Gospel reading inspire us to ask ourselves, what about our own character makes us imperfect? In recognising this, may we then use our imperfections as a guide to accept, welcome and respect the imperfections of one another. In fact, may these imperfections be the glue that helps bind us and restore each one of us to who we are born to be.

May this Lenten Journey give us the courage to turn away from sin.

# **INFORMATION FOR PARENTS**

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

TO BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE THE CSEF FUND PAYMENTS PARENTS MUST BE THE HOLDER OF A GOVERNMENT CONCESSION CARD. CONTACT THE SCHOOL OFFICE FOR MORE DETAILS

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

- if I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DET.
- Information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to the DFFH and /or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.

You are able to request access to the personal information that we hold about you, and to request that any errors be corrected, by contacting your child's school.

#### **CSEF ELIGIBILITY**

and;

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one
- on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent,
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy: https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

#### Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (31 January 2022) or term two (26 April 2022).

#### PAYMENT AMOUNTS

#### CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

#### HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

#### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2022 closes on the 24 June 2022.
