What I would like to share with you is my reflection of what I have observed this week. It's what I am calling 'true glimpses'. In our Sunday Gospel this weekend, we have the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. You see, the story is situated around about the second last week of Jesus' earthly life, where along with his friends, the disciples, he was journeying to celebrate the Passover Feast in Jerusalem. It would be there where Jesus would ultimately be nailed to the cross, giving up his life...but more on that in a few weeks' time! Anyhow, Jesus, taking a couple of unsuspecting disciples up the mountain, stopped for a little while to pray. It was up there that Jesus was 'transfigured' and he shone a radiant white, something brighter than anything that could be bleached

on earth. His disciples were amazed, dazed and afraid. They saw Moses, and Elijah (two other Holy Prophets) and recognising it was good to be there, wanted to make tents for all to stay up there. They soon came to their senses, and where only in Jesus' presence again. In this Transfiguration, it was the one and only time that we get a true glimpse of Jesus. We get to see God embodied in the human form of Christ. The dazzling white and prophecies of past, present and to come.

Why do I share this with you, you may ask? This week, I can with great sincerity and utmost conviction proclaim that in the Staff at Our Lady of Mt Carmel, I witnessed 'true glimpses' of God, in God's glory. 
