Dear Parents and Carers,

My name is Paula Jarski and I am a former Victoria Police Detective with more than 24 years Operational Policing experience. I retired from Victoria Police in July 2022.

I spent the last 18 years of my career working in the specialist field of Sexual Offences and Child Abuse. During the final seven years I was seconded to a team dedicated to managing the risk assessment and detecting criminal offences committed by Registered Victorian Sex Offenders who resided in our Policing Division. I am also a mum of two girls who like many of you are navigating unchartered territory parenting in the digital age.

I am hosting an online information session for parents and carers of OLMC students which will cover topics like general cybersafety, cyberbullying, sexting, online grooming, internet privacy and digital footprints.

The session will mirror the content delivered to the Year 3-6 Students at OLMC on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2023, and will also relay the results of data collected from the Cybersafety Survey completed by students before the in-person session. Past school data has yielded unnerving results which have afforded families the opportunity to rethink their digital habits.

The online Parents and Carers information session is being offered to the entire school community given the prevalence of internet use by children of all ages. We request that due to the nature of some content children **do not** participate in the information session.
